- providing transportation to English classes at Broadview. https://adult.mccsc.edu/

- teaching them using Picture Word cards and pocket-sized notebooks they can carry with them everywhere they go.

For the first time in their lives, they are reading and writing.

They have much to learn and we will be there every step of the way!

Self-sufficiency is the goal.

We want our new friends from Afghanistan, Syria, China, Mexico, Venezuela and many other nations, to feel confident and comfortable in our community.

We want them to be healthy, happy and thriving.

We believe we are richer for their presence among us and we hope to be part of helping them rebuild new lives.

The journeys they have undertaken to get to Bloomington are unimaginable to us, the stories are unique to each person.
